As far as voluntary bodies were concerned, although this criterion was agreed in principle, in practice it was not relevant because the RHA was inundated with requests from voluntary bodies in all districts. Psychiatric hospitals were relevant in two districts, Northumberland with 36 members anyway and Gateshead which was given an extra member. Centres of population were only relevant in Northumberland and South Tees.
